



Foundation Continues Support of Immediate Intervention Program

Los Angeles, CA: August, 2011: The William H. Hannon Foundation has made a \$20,000 gift to renew its support of The Hannon Immediate Intervention Program at Airport Marina Counseling Service (AMCS) in Westchester. Established in 2003, the Intervention Program is designed to help those in the midst of a personal crisis due to death of a friend/family member, illness, trauma, job loss or related economic issues. The Program also provides education and training experiences for interns.
