



Anti-truancy Program at Catholic Big Brothers Big Sisters

Santa Monica, CA (November, 2010)—The William H. Hannon Foundation has made a \$25,000 grant to Catholic Big Brothers Big Sisters (CBBS) to support the organization's successful anti-truancy program. The mentoring program will provide early intervention and prevention services through mentoring relationships for 75 young people who are matched in one-on-one mentoring relationships.
