



Good Shepherd Center for Homeless Women and Children

Los Angeles, CA (March, 2011)—The Good Shepherd Center for Homeless Women and Children’s Languille Emergency Shelter located in the Los Angeles community of Echo Park has received a \$20,000 grant from the William H. Hannon Foundation. The grant will help provide community outreach services, daily response care and emergency shelter for women just off the streets.

Annually, 600 to 800 women receive shelter and services at Good Shepherd Center’s Languille Emergency Shelter. The Shelter can provide a home for up to 30 women each night. In addition, the women receive case management, job search services as well as meals. The shelter’s work is designed to provide a rapid six-week program to empower the women to obtain the resources needed to become self-sufficient.
