

Vinyl Tile Flooring Coming to Marycrest Manor

The William H. Hannon Foundation has provided a \$20,000 grant to Marycrest Manor to replace 14 year-old carpeting that has become worn, unsafe in places and difficult to properly clean and sanitize. Founded in 1956, Marycrest Manor, located in Culver City, is a 57-bed skilled nursing facility, which is owned and operated by the Carmelite Sisters of the Most Sacred Heart of Los Angeles. Marycrest provides a tranquil, home-like environment for its elderly residents, offering healthcare that focuses on the whole person and recognizes the dignity of each individual.

Replacing the flooring at Marycrest will create a safer and cleaner environment for the elderly.
