



William H. Hannon Foundation Renews \$25,000 Annual Scholarship to Marymount High School in Los Angeles

Los Angeles, CA (January 1, 2010)— The William H. Hannon Foundation is once again continuing the William H. Hannon scholarship program at Marymount High School in Los Angeles. The Foundation has recently awarded an annual tuition scholarship of \$25,000 to the school. The Foundation implemented this scholarship in 2001.

“As an alumna who benefited from my Marymount High School education, I am glad our Foundation can help ensure that girls unable to afford the full tuition can also benefit from a Marymount education,” said Kathleen Hannon Aikenhead, President of the William H. Hannon Foundation. Aikenhead is a niece of the late William Hannon, and has served on the Foundation’s Board of Directors since its founding by her uncle in 1983.

Founded in 1923, Marymount High School is an independent, Catholic, college preparatory school for girls in grades nine through twelve. Marymount provides purposeful leadership training, a rigorous academic program and extensive co-curricular opportunities that challenge and inspire students to be educated, informed and socially responsible global citizens. Students enrolled in Marymount in the fall of 2009 come from 88 different feeder schools and 70 zip codes with over 25% of the student body receiving financial aid.
