



Marymount High School Marks 10th Anniversary of Scholarship Support by the William H. Hannon Foundation

Santa Monica, CA (November 9, 2011)—The William H. Hannon Foundation has renewed a \$25,000 scholarship contribution to Marymount High School, a Catholic, independent all women’s high school in Los Angeles. 2011 marks the tenth consecutive year of scholarship support by the Foundation to Marymount High School. Each year, Marymount selects four Hannon Scholars based upon financial need and academic performance. Two Hannon Scholars who graduated from Marymount High School this past summer entered Loyola Marymount University as freshmen this fall.

Students come to Marymount High School from 83 different feeder schools and from 70 zip codes. “Marymount’s commitment to financial aid is essential to sustaining the school’s lived mission of services and of access to students from parishes and elementary schools throughout all of Los Angeles County,” said Jacqueline L. Landry, Head of School.

“My late uncle, our Foundation’s founder, deeply admired the educational work of the Sisters of the Religious of the Sacred Heart of Mary (RSHM) who founded and inspire Marymount High School.
